Check your voter registration card or letter for your correct voting site. All voters are required to present identification at the polls.

Contact your General Registrar for appropriate forms of identification, or visit the VA Department of Elections website.

You are eligible to register to vote if you are:

1. A citizen of the United States

2.A resident of Virginia

3.At least 18 years of age by the next general election.

VOTER REGISTRATION

Where You may apply online or at the following sites: City Registrar 's Office, Department of Motor Vehicles Offices; Public Assistance Agency offices, i.e., those offering food stamps, aid to dependent children and/or aid to persons with disabilities, etc.; Military Recruitment Offices, or District Governmental Centers. For other locations and for more information contact vour General Registrar.

When. You may register year-round except the 21 days prior to a general or primary election or 13 days prior to a special election. Same day registration is available during early voting within the 21 days before election day as a provisional ballot.

Registration will be permanent under most circumstances.

To remain a qualified voter, you must notify your local voter registration office of any change in your name or address. You For information, contact your General Registrar. Move

ABSENTEE VOTING

Any registered voter may request an absentee ballot.

By Mail or Fax: Absentee ballot application forms are available at the voter registration office or can be downloaded from the voter registration website. A voter can opt to have Mail-In ballots for future elections mailed instead of submitting an application for each election. Completed mailed-in applications must be received no later than 5pm on the 11th day before an election. Voted ballots returned via USPS must be postmarked by election day and received by the registrar by noon of the 3rd business day after the election.

In Person: Registered voters may vote during early voting at the Registrar's office beginning 45 days before an election. In-person early voting ends at 5pm on the Saturday before each election.
